Amblyopappus pusillus Hooker & Arnott, COAST WEED. Annual, taprooted, 1(-several)stemmed at base, typically branching above midpoint to form a  $\pm$  flat-topped or rounded flowering canopy, erect, in range 8–25 cm tall; shoots glabrous, densely dotted with sessile resin glands, strongly aromatic (reminiscent of tarragon, Artemisia dracunculus), in fresh condition somewhat sticky, becoming very resinous after picked. **Stems:** somewhat ridged, to 5 mm diameter, tough, becoming pale orange-brown. Leaves: helically alternate (opposite at the lowest nodes), simple or at shoot base occasionally deeply pinnately dissected with 3 or 5 lobes, sessile, without stipules; blade and lobes linear, 5–  $25(-35) \times 0.7-2$  mm, somewhat fleshy, entire, blunt-rounded at tip, midrib conspicuous and sunken on upper surface. **Inflorescence:** heads, terminal, in leafy, cymelike panicle arrays, heads clustered at branch tips, head  $\pm$  disciform with (0)3–8 pistillate peripheral flowers opposite phyllaries and to 22 bisexual disc flowers, bracteate; bract subtending peduncle leaflike, at anthesis < 15 mm long; peduncle 1.5–12 mm long, < subtending bract; **involucre** at anthesis inversely conic,  $3-3.5 \times 2-3.5$  mm, becoming bell-shaped and 3–6 mm diameter in fruit, phyllaries (3-)4-5(-8) in  $\pm 1$  series, obovate, 2–3.5 mm long increasing to 5 mm in fruit, overlapping, green sometimes with rose-colored midvein; receptacle broadly short-conic, without bractlets (paleae), glabrous. **Peripheral (ray) flower:** pistillate, inconspicuously bilateral, ca. 0.5 mm across; **calvx (pappus)** of 7–12 scales, scales erect, unequal, oblong, 0.15–0.3 mm long, flattened, white or red-purple especially above midpoint becoming ± transparent, unlobed to 3-lobed; corolla inconspicuously 2-toothed, 0.7–1.1 mm long, bright yellow, with erect limbs; stamens absent; **pistil** 1; ovary inferior, narrowly inversely conic and curved, 0.8–2 mm long, ascendingly scabrous, 1-chambered with 1 ovule; style exserted, 0.8–1.1 mm long, yellowish aging orangey brown, 2-branched, the stigmatic branches  $\pm$  0.4 mm long. **Disc flower:** bisexual, radial, 0.5 mm across, 2 mm long; **calvx (pappus)** of 7–12 scales, scales erect, unequal, oblong to obovate, 0.15–0.3 mm long, flattened, white or red-purple especially above midpoint becoming  $\pm$  transparent, unlobed to 3-lobed; **corolla** 4(-5)lobed, funnel-shaped, ca. 1 mm long; tube pale yellow; throat bright yellow; lobes ascending, deltate, bright yellow; **stamens** 4, fused to corolla at base of throat; filaments 0.2 mm long, colorless; anthers fused into cylinder surrounding style, slightly exserted, basifixed, dithecal, 0.35 mm long, pale yellow, longitudinally dehiscent; pollen pale yellow; **pistil** 1; ovary inferior, narrowly inversely conic and curved, 0.8–2 mm long, ascendingly scabrous, 1-chambered with 1 ovule; style exserted, 0.8–1.1 mm long, yellowish aging orangey brown, 2-branched, the branches  $\pm$  0.4 mm long, stigmas triangular. Fruits: cypselae, inversely narrowly pyramidal and slightly curved (outer flowers) or straight (inner flowers), ca. 2.2 × 0.5 mm, black, 3–4 angled, short-scabrous, faces glandular and finely cobblestonelike near base; enveloped in a tawny brown, membranous layer; pappus scales 7–12, erect, oblong to obovate, persistent. Late March-early June.

Native. Annual rarely encountered on sandy flats just above beaches, in range known only from Point Dume at 45–60 meters in elevation. *Amblyopappus pusillus* only is observed in certain years; during most years rainfall is not adequate or properly received for this plant to appear, so only expect to find this species during the wettest springs. The resinous nature of *Amblyopappus pusillus* becomes exaggerated after it is placed into a plastic bag

or pressed to make an herbarium specimen, but unmolested this plant is only slightly sticky.

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
